


## PMI SUN CITY CHAPTER MONTHLY NEWSLETTER


### May 2022 Sun City Annual Meeting and Social

## ANNUAL MEETING –

The Chapter President updated Chapter members on the state of the Chapter. The Agenda was as follows:

Over the last two years, Chapter membership has dropped. Chapter membership stood at one time over 200 members and has taken a fraction of a drop, most likely due to COVID and changes in the economy. We continue to find new methods of engaging our members into worthwhile opportunities and will continue into the coming years as we shift over to new Chapter Leaders.

Chapter finances stand at over \$21,000. To keep up with changes, the chapter has invested in technology hardware that will help the Chapter better conduct virtual meetings. In addition, PMI HQ reimbursed the Chapter up to \$5,000 in operational costs, in addition to the newly procured hardware. The Chapter's goal is to use these funds to continue to engage our members and support professional development programs.

The Chapter is planning a July/August Professional Development Day and you will be receiving information regarding that. Keep an eye out for upcoming Social; the next one planned for August. This event will be a hybrid or live/online format. More information will be sent to Chapter members once a date has been finalized.

The Chapter will continue to focus on outreach to the military, to colleges and to high schools. The Chapter typically partners with Ft. Bliss' Onward to Opportunity professional development program and has recently done outreach to high school and is alignment with PMI's new strategy to reach out to high school and college aged students and the development mentoring programs.

The Chapter also proposed changes to the Bylaws this year. The goal is to create an office of Chapter Mentor. This elected board member will need to have been a past president or have served as two or three of the Chapter Board Member roles or as a director/manager, respectively.

Sun City Chapter Board elections are right around the corner. Present Chapter Board Members were introduced and all of the following officers will be up for re-election or stepping down after this term. During the meeting, it was asked how can one run for office? All one has to do to be considered a candidate is submit a mini-bio about you experience in Project Management and how you feel your skills can benefit the Chapter.
